

The Sudbury Finnish Rest Home Society is 40 years young!

A membership Society, the Sudbury Finnish Rest Home Society is the owner of Finlandia Village. Founded in 1982, the Society's aim was to provide seniors' housing in a Finnish lifestyle. Governed by a twelve-member volunteer Board of Directors and the President, the Society has seen Finlandia Village evolve into a unique continuum of care facility. Its first building, Finlandiakoti was completed in 1984, followed by the Supportive Housing Palvelukoti, the Hoivakoti

Nursing Home and the Lepokoti Rest Home. In addition, life-lease Rivitalo townhouses and the Majatalo were built to accommodate Finnish interns and to appeal to everyone's needs in housing.

The Finnish word "koti" is part of all buildings and means "home". Prominently used is also the word "sisu", which means "perseverance, determination, grit", qualities exemplifying the strong will and spirit of the founding members of the Society. Our Sisu Foundation is also the fundraising arm of our Society. Finlandia Village now boasts a large membership, an army of volunteers and a workforce of about 300 taking care of our 400 multicultural residents. Our rich variety of amenities offer all residents activities both inside and outside.

Finlandia Village receives 2022 Rainbow School Board Community Partnership Award



Finlandia Village has been working in partnership with Lasalle Secondary School for more than a decade. It started with their support of the Memoirs Writing Project. Students interviewed residents to capture their rich life stories in words and photos. The partnership has since evolved to focus on active living for seniors to enhance their quality of life.

The entire Lasalle Secondary School community is committed to promoting health and wellness for all. To date, more than \$100,000 has been raised for the Finlandia SISU Charitable Foundation through the annual Sling-Choker SISU Family Walk. Most recently, Lasalle participated in the Around Australia walking challenge, a fundraising journey of 14 million steps for the ongoing expansion of walking trails.

Finlandia Village is an important partner in education. When students are engaged in the community, they learn lessons that last a lifetime.

Accepting the award on behalf of Finlandia Village is Chief Executive Officer David Munch.

Stitching our Roots - The Threads of our Lifetime

The goal of this project was to interpret the history of Finnish immigration to Canada, and to depict the culture and life of Finnish Canadians in a tactile and vibrant art installation.

The textile element of this installation titled "Stitching our Roots" is a composition of small squares on antique linens, which were embroidered by Finlandia Village residents. They symbolize decades of stories literally woven within the antique tablecloths and napkins used in this piece. The three strong silver birch trees illustrate Sisu in a visual form - the perseverance of the Finnish national tree despite the elements, disease and exposure to herbicides. The rows of horizontal stitches echo the traditional rag rug, with its long history as an important part of Finnish cultural heritage.

The four panels titled "The Threads of our Lifetime" tell a story of the importance of Northern Ontario nature to early immigrants in search of a landscape to call home. Finnish people have an extraordinarily close relationship with nature and the changing seasons. This vibrant polyptych serves as a reminder that the flow of nature has, and will continue to be, a significant part of the Finnish spirit.

Each mixed media panel is painted on Baltic Birch as the foundation, with the grains of the wood left exposed in some areas. Each panel is finished with a high gloss epoxy emphasizing the natural grain of the wood against the vibrancy of the acrylic paint and material used to create this unique art. The scene depicts 4 seasons with 4 iconic trees to both Northern Ontario and Finland. The Finnish National flower (Lily of the Valley) and Ontario's Provincial flower (Trillium) can be found in the spring scene.

A Whooper Swan flies above the textile and mixed media pieces. She holds in her beak all of the materials and threads used in the creation of the works below as a legacy to the stories of men and women, over centuries and across continents. This hand-carved bird is made of solid cherry and demonstrates the strength and perseverance of early immigrants to Canada. The Whooper Swan is the national bird of Finland.



Juuremme pisto pistolta - elämämme säikeet

Tämän projektin tavoitteena oli tulkita Suomesta Kanadaan muuttaneiden siirtolaisten historiaa ja kuvata heidän kulttuuriaan ja elämäänsä taktiisessa ja värikkäässä taideinstallaatiossa.

Tämän "Juuremme pisto pistolta" -installaation tekstiiliaines koostuu pienistä neliöistä vanhoilla kankailla, joihin Finlandiakylän asukkaat tekivät koruompeleita. Ne symboloivat vuosikymmenten tarinoita, jotka on kirjaimellisesti kudottu teoksessa käytettyihin vanhoihin pöytä- ja lautasliinoihin. Teoksen kolme hopeista koivua kuvaavat visuaalisesti sisua - Suomen kansallispuun sitkeyttä säästä, taudeista ja myrkyille alistumisesta huolimatta. Vaakasuorat pistot jäljittelevät perinnäistä räsymattoa, jolla on pitkä historia tärkeänä osana suomalaista kulttuuria.

"Elämämme säikeet" -nimiset neljä paneelia kertovat Pohjois-Ontarion luonnon tärkeydestä varhaisille siirtolaisille heidän etsiessään kotoista maisemaa. Suomalaisilla on harvinaisen läheinen suhde luontoon ja vaihtuviin vuodenaikoihin. Tämä värikäs polyptyykkityö muistuttaa siitä, että luonnon kululla on - ja tulee olemaan - tärkeä osa suomalaisuudessa.

Jokainen multimediapaneeli on maalattu baltiankoivupuulle. Puun uurteet ovat paikoitellen näkyvissä. Jokainen paneeli viimeistellään korkeakiiltoisella lakalla korostamaan puun luonnollisia uurteita vastakohtana akryylimaalain kirkkaudelle ja materiaalille, jota on käytetty tämän uniikkitaiteen valmistamiseen. Paneelissa kuvataan neljä vuodenaikaa neljällä sekä Pohjois-Ontariolle että Suomelle ikonisella puulla. Suomen kansalliskukka kielo ja Ontarion maakuntakukka trillium löytyvät kevätpaneelistä.

Laulujoutsen lentää tekstiili- ja multimediaosien yläpuolella. Se pitää nokassaan kaikkia niitä materiaaleja ja lankoja, joita on käytetty alapuolella olevien töiden luomiseen perintönä miesten ja naisten tarinoista kautta vuosisatojen ja yli mantereiden. Tämä käsin kaiverrettu lintu on tehty aidosta kirsikkapuusta ja on osoitus Kanadaan tulleiden siirtolaisten luonteen lujuudesta ja peräänantamattomuudesta. Laulujoutsen on Suomen kansallislintu.



Stitching our Roots — Threads of our Lifetime

Local artist, Gillian Schultze, invited us to participate in a threading project. All pieces submitted were incorporated into a piece of art on a separate panel that is included in the final installation.






About the Artists

Gillian Schulze and Chris Gore are the creative partnership who designed and brought this art installation to fruition. Gillian is a full-time artist who was born and raised in the City of Greater Sudbury. Many Sudburians will easily recognize the strikingly unique style of Gillian's work, as she incorporates textile and thread to bring her imagination to life in her art. Hers is an art form that speaks to the beauty of the landscape, often depicting the trees, rocks, birds, and waters of Northeastern Ontario. What is most unique in her work is that she advocates for the protection of our wilderness areas in the province by celebrating and raising awareness of the sheer beauty of those spaces. Chris spent his full-time career as a community builder working on a number of significant projects throughout the city. In his retirement, he discovered that he is a meticulous woodworker, creating unique frames for Gillian's creations, as well as handcrafting original works of art.

Gillian Schulze ja Chris Gore ovat tämän taideinstallaation luovat suunnittelijat ja toteuttajat. Gillian on Sudburyssa syntynyt ja kasvanut täysiaikainen taiteilija. Monet kaupunkilaiset tunnistavat helposti Gillianin töiden sävyttävän tyylin: yhdistämällä tekstiilejä ja lankoja hän herättää mielikuvituksensa eloon taiteessaan. Hänen taiteensa kertoo maiseman kauneudesta ja kuvaa usein Koillis-Ontarion puita, kallioita, lintuja ja vesistöjä. Ainutlaatuisinta hänen töissään on se, että hän puhuu taiteellaan provinssin erämaa-alueiden suojaamisen puolesta ja edistää tietoisuutta niiden kauneudesta. Chris teki työuransa yhteiskunta-alalla ja osallistui moneen merkittävään projektiin eri puolilla kaupunkia. Eläkkeellä ollessaan hän huomasi olevansa tarkka ja huolellinen puutöiden tekijä, joka valmistaa omaperäisiä kehyksiä Gillianin taidetoille sekä tekee käsityönä omia taideteoksia.
